Raffle Ticket Instructions

As you know, we rely on fundraising to keep Wolverine Lacrosse affordable for all families. Our TVYLA board is asking for each player to sell 5 raffle tickets in order to supplement the cost of the lacrosse program.

At **\$10.00** per ticket this means each player will bring in \$50.00 at the minimum! We encourage all players to sell as many as possible since there will be a **\$100.00 grand prize** to the player that does. The **runner-up will receive \$50.00**.

- Grand Prize is \$500 and Runner up will receive \$250
- Each Player will be given 5 tickets in a zip lock bag
- When a ticket is sold. The purchaser will keep the large side of the ticket and the player keeps the ticket stub with all pertinent information on it. (i.e. name, phone number and venmo)
- The Wolverine Venmo QR code is on the back of the ticket. **Ask purchasers to write their venmo username on the ticket stub if they are not paying cash.**
- If paying with venmo ask the purchaser to label the venmo transaction **Lacrosse Raffle**
- Any player can ask for more tickets from their team parent or coach
- Return the ticket stubs and all monies collected in the zip lock bag you were given the raffle tickets in originally. The player will **return the same zip lock bag to their team parent with their name and the number of tickets sold written on the bag by Friday, April 26th.**
- The winners will be announced **May 1st at 5:30pm** The lucky winners will be directly contacted and the good news will be posted on social media.



2024 Volunteer Hour Requirements

VOLUNTEER DEPOSIT: In order to continue developing our nonprofit Youth Lacrosse program, parents are required to volunteer a minimum of **10 hours per player**. K/2 and 3/4 players' parents are only required to volunteer **5 hours per player**. While many of our volunteer opportunities are offered during the spring season, our organization has ways to volunteer year round!

Opportunities include coaching, helping at the Driggs Jamboree, fundraising, being a team manager, Tin Cup, working the scoreboard table, end of the season party Thursday, June 13, helping with social media posts and more.

For families with multiple children registered with TVYLA, the deposit and the volunteer hours commitment will be capped at 2 children. A \$100 deposit per child (maximum deposit \$200) in the form of CHECK written to 'TVYLA' will be held, but not cashed, to insure this commitment by all families. When the volunteer hours are completed, the check will be shredded. If volunteer hours are not completed and reported by **Thursday October 31, 2024** the deposit will be cashed and donated to TVYLA the following Monday.

Please note:

- Volunteer deposit must be in hand before the first practice in order for your child to participate.
- Please make check out to: TVYLA. Check Date: **Oct 31, 2024**
- Checks can be dropped off at Gear Pick Up (date: TBD), given to your team manager or mailed to TVYLA at PO Box 874, Victor ID 83455
- EXEMPTIONS:
 - 1. Coaches who have coached two seasons or more for TVYLA and are currently coaching for the 2023-2024 season are exempt from this deposit.
 - 2. If you have more than two kids participating in the program the third child is exempt. We have capped this deposit at 2 players or \$200.
